

Dr. Hall is the Co-Chair of the National System for Geospatial-Intelligence's (NSG) Working Group for Automation, Artificial Intelligence, and Augmentation and Director of NGA Analysis' Stakeholder Engagement office. Representing NSG and ASG (Allied System for Geospatial-Intelligence) equities, Dr. Hall works to align various modernization efforts, such as computer vision and artificial intelligence, across the GEOINT Community. Previously, Dr. Hall was the Advanced Analytics/Activity Based Intelligence Portfolio Initiative Lead for NGA.

In 2015, Dr. Hall completed a Joint Duty Rotation at DIA's Executive Support Office and served as the Intelligence Liaison Officer for the Assistant Secretaries of Defense for Legislative Affairs and Public Affairs, the Deputy Assistant Secretaries of Defense for House and Senate Affairs, the Pentagon Press Secretary, and their respective Staff. During this assignment, Dr. Hall received the DIA Director's Award for his contributions to the Defense Intelligence Enterprise. Prior to this, he was the primary Lidar Integration Officer for NGA's Analysis Directorate and deeply involved several airborne lidar programs.

In addition to his aforementioned duties, Dr. Hall served NGA as the Lidar Sciences Branch Chief in the Office of Sciences and Methodologies and was recognized in 2012 as the GEOINT Analyst of the Year for Imagery Science. Dr. Hall joined the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency in 2009 as an Image Scientist.

Dr. Hall earned a doctoral degree in Forest Resources from Clemson University, focusing on remote sensing techniques and advanced Geographic Information Systems applications and methodologies. He lives in Northern Virginia with his wife and children.
